Presentation of Christ in the temple

'Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation.' Luke 2: 29 – 30

Simeon lived a long life, and spent it serving God in the Temple. He does not seem to have had great career goals and his bucket list was short – no safaris or cruises, no bungee jumping or hot air ballooning. In fact there was just one thing on it: he was waiting for the consolation of Jerusalem, the coming of the peace of God to his people. And as the infant Jesus was brought to the temple by his parents, towards the end of the final chapter of his life, that waiting ended, his longing was satisfied. He recognised in Jesus the coming of the forgiveness, the peace and the hope that God had promised and his people desperately needed. Our lives will be vastly different from Simeon's – more varied, more changeable, more cluttered perhaps – but we can pray that they will have the same single focus, to celebrate and share the coming of the consolation of God's people in Jesus Christ.

Lord, you fulfilled the hope of Simeon and Anna, who lived to welcome the Messiah; may we, who have received your gifts and trusted our Son, our Saviour, prepare to meet Christ Jesus when he comes to bring us to eternal life, for he is alive and reigns, now and for ever.

09 February 2025 Racial Justice Sunday

There before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands. 10 And they cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation belongs to our God,

who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb.' Revelation 7: 9 – 10

The picture of heaven the John presents tells us that ethnic diversity is part of God's eternal plan. There is little doubt that British churches, especially in the larger cities, are a microcosm of the world in a congregation, and this is a great blessing to be celebrated. Even more, the fact that the diversity of believers has breathed spiritual life into our churches shows us that this is a movement of God, and we praise him for it.

Yet, despite this amazing reality, inequality still exists in the church and blights the experiences of too many of Global Majority heritage. This leaves people not feeling as if they belong, or

not being given the opportunity to use their God-given talents to further the Lord's Kingdom. So as we praise God for the gift of diversity we pray for his grace so that we might truly honour it.

Lord Jesus, in Your life You showed us how to live. In Your death You reconciled us to God. In Your resurrection You made the way to a new community. May we know pardon and peace in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Come, Holy Spirit, show us Your beauty, reflected in all the peoples of the earth, so that we may discover anew that all are important and all are necessary, different faces of the one humanity made in the image and for the glory of God. Amen

Having a generous spirit

'Be merciful even as your Father is merciful' Luke 6: 36

To be a Christian is never solely an inward matter. Some have grown up in the church thinking that it is – spiritual matters are personal, hidden deep in the heart. Sometimes they are so deep, however, that they scarcely trouble the surface of our lives. God and Jesus Christ are rarely spoken about and are easily masked by other concerns. However, in his most famous address, the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus discourages this thinking. He speaks about a faith in God that is inward and deep – God is concerned with our motivation as well as our behaviour. But he also describes a life in which our daily activity is radically shaped as we imitate God. Turn the other cheek, share you clothes, pray for the people who abuse you, love your enemy. You can't do these things secretly. And at the same time we will never change outwardly without a profound change of heart. Inward and outward, in the depths and at the surface, Jesus encourages a life of reality and integrity. We pray that God would change us so we are like him, overflowing in mercy.

Almighty God,

You have created the heavens and the earth and made us in your own image; teach us to discern your hand in all your works, and your likeness in all your children; through Jesus Christ your son our Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit reigns supreme over all things, now and for ever. Amen
