Diocesan Counselling Service

People contact the Diocesan Counselling Services for a variety of reasons – but essentially for just one reason; to be listened to. Being listened to is a powerful and potentially transformative experience. Whether someone is in crisis or at a crossroads, bereaved or traumatised, anxious or depressed, the presence of a skilled counsellor can be hugely supportive, the agent of real change. Our counselling service is available to any Anglican in the diocese; it is a free service, although we welcome donations.

This service, unique in the Church of England, is made possible through the voluntary work of a team of qualified counsellors, with the addition of one or two trainees on placement, under the supervision of the Head of Counselling Services, the Revd Peter Mackriell. Counsellors work in a variety of locations across the diocese and, as a result of the pandemic, via video or on the phone. We currently have a waiting list for counselling and may refer to other agencies for alternative sources of support..

We also offer pastoral supervision to clergy and lay ministers. Based on the model of monthly supervision familiar to counsellors, pastoral supervision provides a safe confidential space for ministers to reflect on their work and its impact on them, every month or two, and to process the issues that arise in parish work. Pastoral supervision gives a framework that helps to identify healthy patterns of ministry and supports the minister in making clear decisions about their work.

Sisters of Jesus Way

In September 1979 our two founder Sisters gave up their money and possessions in answer to a call from God and the Sisters of Jesus Way was formed. The commitment made then, to trust the Heavenly Father for all their needs, is the path still followed by the Sisters. Instrumental strands in the formation of the community have been the Gospels, the Charismatic Renewal, and the lives of saints from many denominations.

A large semi-detached house was given to the community in West Kirby, Wirral. Visitors began to arrive and within five years the house was too small. The Heavenly Father then gave the Sisters a beautiful detached house set in an acre of land. When this also became too small to accommodate both the community and visitors, the Sisters built a motherhouse for the community in the garden. At first there was only enough money for the foundations, and then only if we did them ourselves! The Heavenly Father was faithful and in four years we were able to move in. To God be all the praise and glory.

Our calling is to love the Lord Jesus with a first love, to trust the Heavenly Father as his dear children for all our needs both spiritual and material and to allow the Holy Spirit to guide and lead us. Prayer, either using the framework of a simple liturgy or informal, is central to all that we do. We make life promises of simplicity, fidelity and chastity. Our work for the Lord varies as the Holy Spirit opens or closes doors. We welcome guests, trusting that as the Lord Jesus lives with us, they will meet with him and experience his grace. Music, some of which has been composed by the Sisters, is very much part of our life. We work together learning from the Lord to live together as a family in love, forgiveness and harmony.

Prayer Points

- That the Lord would call more Sisters and Brothers to join us.
- For grace to live a simple lifestyle in a complex society.
- That people needing rest and refreshment would find a place of welcome in our guest house, especially clergy, pastors and other church leaders.
- That the Heavenly Father would provide faithfully for all our needs.
- That we would continue to live in love and forgiveness as a community, finding our joy in Jesus and following the promptings of the Holy Spirit.
