Curates in training

There are currently just over 50 curates training across the diocese, serving in parishes alongside colleagues who are committed to their formation and wellbeing. Curates train for a variety of ministries. Some are full time and some part time, some self-supporting or Ministers in Secular Employment, but each is placed within a parish which provides the primary context for their training. Curates experience the breadth of ministry in the Church of England: under the guidance of a supervising minister they gradually take on ministerial responsibility, they 'have a go' with permission to make mistakes, and they reflect theologically on their learning and practice. Through a variety of creative tasks they are able to evidence their growth in discipleship and deepening formation for the ministry to which they are called.

Curates give substantial time to coming together to reflect and learn. This enables them to seek fellowship and build relationships with peers and the wider diocese, and to learn from a variety of practitioners and experts in different fields. They give time to reading and prayer, and they are strongly encouraged to build habits that will sustain them through a lifetime of ministry and service. In this way, curates often set an example to others in prioritising lifelong learning, prayer, and life-giving ways of ministering. The demands of formation mean that curacy is often a time of both struggle and growth as God works within these leaders of the church.

Mike Gilbertson, Archdeacon of Chester

Archdeacon Mike looks after 134 parishes in nine deaneries on the western side of the diocese, stretching from Lymm and Middlewich down to Malpas and across to the top of the Wirral. As an archdeacon his particular responsibilities include pastoral care, making clergy appointments, clergy housing, and helping parishes in mission and in looking after their church buildings. He spends a lot of time travelling around the diocese meeting clergy, churchwardens and PCCs. Mike is assisted in his role by his PA, Laura Howard.

As well as the core responsibilities which come with being an archdeacon, Mike has several other roles in the diocese, including:

- Chairing the Diocesan Board of Education;
- Leading the diocesan teams working on Everyday Faith (resourcing congregations in living out their Christian faith), and Growing Faith (helping churches, schools and families in nurturing children and young people in the Christian faith);
- Connecting with the hospital and hospice chaplains across the diocese.

Mike has asked for prayer for various particular things:

- Wisdom and discernment in filling the clergy vacancies in our parishes;
- Effectiveness in encouraging parishes and church schools in their mission and ministry;
- Sensitivity and wisdom in helping people across the diocese who are still tired and anxious as a result of Covid;
- Ensuring that in all of these busy situations he still has time for prayer, Bible reading and rest.

My role is to encourage and enable the first two marks of mission in churches and other ministries across the diocese - in simple words, to promote evangelism and discipleship. We also provide information for parishes to explore other sources of support, and especially Jesus Shaped People, Leading your Church into Growth and the forthcoming Leading Evangelism Learning Hub.

We also love listening to the stories of what God is doing locally, and sharing those stories, and making links between people across the diocese who are exploring the same things or facing the same opportunities.

- That churches will honestly explore how they can help people come to know God's love for themselves, and put it into practice
- For the Leading Evangelism Learning Hub that launches in January, that preparations will go smoothly, and churches will get involved
- That churches will find appropriate ways in the present context of helping their members to grow as disciples
- That as an outreach team we can support parishes and ministries in a way that is helpful and encouraging

Jonathan Masters - Youth, Children and Families' Adviser

Ministry among children and young people is going through a particularly turbulent time as we continue to emerge from the pandemic. Many volunteers have stepped back, and some families have disappeared from churches completely. However, there are vast opportunities if we look for them. The Growing Faith Adventure invites us to prioritise children and young people in decision-making, and to support the links between churches, schools and households. Over 1/3 of parents and carers are not confident talking about their faith at home with their children, yet over 70% of Christian children and young people would put family as their top reason for coming to faith and keeping their faith. In the next year at Church House we are aiming to enable churches and schools to be even more effective in supporting families to talk about faith at home. Please pray for us as we go on that journey.

Our five prayer points. Please pray that:

- 1. Every parish joins in the Growing Faith Adventure
- 2. Children and young people are given opportunities in Church services to encounter Christ, not just to learn about him
- 3. Parents and carers grow in confidence to talk about their faith with their children
- 4. Children and young people are listened to, and their points of view are acted upon
- 5. Safeguarding continues to be prioritised and celebrated as part of the good news of Jesus Christ
