Looking after each other

As this spring term progresses, we hope that you and your pupils are keeping safe and well. We are aware that schools are experiencing high numbers of staff and pupil absence and this is causing continued disruption and stress. Thank you for your on-going hard work and commitment to the mental health, safety and wellbeing of your pupils and staff.

The start of this month is Children's Mental Health Week (7th-11th February) and we have signposted some resources which you may wish to share with your pupils (page 3). This year's theme is focussed on 'growing together' and is about growing emotionally and finding ways to help each other grow. It is recognised that emotional growth is often a gradual process that happens over time, and sometimes we might feel a bit 'stuck'. Learning together and working with others can help us find strategies to work through such situations and we can grow in our understanding and feel better placed to deal with such situations in the future.

Two key events coming up and highlighted in this bulletin, firstly our first RE Leaders' Conference takes place on Friday 20th May, it would be great to see your school represented. Later in the year will see the return of our Year 6 Leavers' Services at Chester Cathedral on Wednesday 13th July, with a service in the morning and afternoon. Booking forms available soon.

Important Admissions Reminder for VA Schools & Academies

This is a reminder to VA schools and academies that your 2023 admission arrangements **must** be 'determined' which means approved by the Governing Body/Trust Board/Local Governing Body (depending on delegated arrangements) by 28th February.

We would also like to remind you that if there are any changes made (unless made to comply with the code) that the policy must be consulted upon for a minimum of 6 weeks from 1st October. We are always working 2 years in advance and so any changes for the 2023 arrangements should have been through this process. If it has not then you need to revert to your previous arrangements and will need to consult from October this year for the 2024 arrangements.



Acton C of E Primary School



On Monday 10th January, Acton CE Primary Academy Wellbeing Warriors had an exciting opportunity to work alongside One Goal to become accredited Wellbeing Community Champions.

As part of their certified training, the wellbeing warriors identified what the 4 stages of mental health are and how to recognise and regulate the different feelings they may experience. The children learnt different strategies to achieve a healthy mental state such as meditation, calming strategies and wellbeing games.


The children additionally learnt different strategies to identify when their mental health is being impacted and how to move back from a 'blue' or 'amber' mental state. Most importantly the children learnt that communication and self-regulation play a vital role in mental health. They are looking forward to relaying the message back to their classmates and taking an active role in promoting a healthy mental state across the school.

Before Christmas, Andrew Moffat, founder of No Outsiders visited. Andrew worked with each class before delivering a staff meeting where he shared the journey he had been on in developing the programme and the barriers he had overcome. Staff were incredibly inspired and couldn't wait to deliver their first lesson at the start of Spring term. Here are a few of the highlights

Year Two's acted out the story 'Blown Away' by Rob Biddulph.

They concluded that it is not true that different animals can't be friends because they are different from each other. People are all different, but we can all get along and help one another.



For the first of their No Outsiders lessons, Year 6 class focused on the book 'My Princess Boy' by Cheryl Kilodavis. After the reading the book, they had a mature class discussion about how the boy could be made to feel welcome and accepted if he came to our school, in which the class established that he would be welcomed with open arms, supporting the No Outsiders ethos of inclusivity, recognising that 'No one is the same, but everyone is equal.'

After reading the book 'My Family' by Todd Parr, Reception introduced their families proudly by drawing a picture of them and then showing the class who is part of their family. We have displayed the pictures along with some more books about families near our reading area so they can learn how different but amazing everyone's families are.

This half term the school's Christian value is 'peace'. In class Worships they have been thinking about what peace means to them. Year 5 children created graffiti posters where they drew pictures relating to peace. In Year 1, the children created peace doves and they thought that peace was when you are relaxed and silent, they have been working on having 'moments of peace' throughout the day to collect their own thoughts. As a whole school, they have talked about how Jesus told stories about peace keepers and peace makers. They have thought about how they can be peace makers and keepers in their own everyday lives.

2022 kicked off in impressive style with a whole school Planetarium visit from Catalyst Science Discovery Centre to tie in with their current topic of space.

They were treated to an hour-long session in a huge inflatable planetarium where they explored the planets and constellations and watched a video which was projected all around them. They then had a science demonstration about Mars and did a few experiments focussing on what life would be like on Mars and whether other life forms could exist. This provoked some excellent discussions from KS2 children. They looked at images from an infra-red camera of

themselves and compared heat levels in different people and parts of the body.

The Bishops' Blue Coat C of E High School


