Thank you for your continued support as a member school of our Family of Schools. Your ongoing membership, along with 114 other church schools in the Diocese, underscores the importance and value we place on the strong partnership with and service received from the Diocesan Board of Education (DBE) and its officers.

We greatly appreciate the opportunity to work closely with you, supporting and equipping your school to deliver a highquality education grounded in Christian faith and values. Our aim is to enable every child and adult in our schools to flourish and experience the abundant life promised by Jesus (John 10:10), where our schools are communities that are loving in relationships, ambitious in aspirations and bold in actions.

As the DBE does not receive public funding from the Government or the Diocese, our ability to provide a highquality service to all schools and academies in the Diocese relies on contributions from the Family of Schools. These contributions enable us to maintain an Education Team dedicated to supporting our schools. While the DBE heavily subsidises the true cost of our support, we have found it necessary to increase the subscription fee for 2023-24 due to rising operational costs. Nevertheless, our membership fees remain the lowest among North West dioceses, ensuring exceptional value for money.

This booklet outlines the benefits, services, training, courses, and networks available to you as a member of the Family of Schools. We have made enhancements for the upcoming year to demonstrate our commitment to increased engagement and support for each school. Notably, we have introduced a designated visit and extended meeting with a DBE officer for every school in the Family of Schools. These interactions will help tailor our support to meet the specific needs and priorities of your school and context. This replaces the previous school support session, which will continue to be available for a fee.

Once again, we extend our gratitude for your continued support of the DBE and its Family of Schools' membership. Together, we can make a positive and sustainable difference in the education and lives of all who attend our church schools, enabling children and adults to thrive.

ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP FEE 2023-24

The annual membership fee for primary schools has seen a small uplift in the membership fee from last year. To provide a fairer spread of the cost an additional tier has been added for our largest schools. The cost of our support to schools and academies remains heavily subsidised and we believe continues to provide excellent value for money.

Membership is charged at half-rate for joint denomination schools or schools that are served by more than one diocese. Multi-Academy Trusts with three or more church schools are entitled to a 10% discount. Schools will receive an invoice for the required amount in the first half of the autumn term.

A designated visit and extended meeting from a DBE Officer


As a member school, you will receive a visit from a DBE officer who will meet with the headteacher, and if appropriate other key staff/stakeholders, to understand the individual needs, context and priorities of your school. The meeting will enable discussion regarding the support available from the DBE that is bespoke to the needs of your school and enables us to work with you in tailoring the support to meet your needs.

In addition, Family of Schools members will also receive a range of services and support free of charge. These are listed on the next page.

Tailored school support is available in connection with church school distinctiveness, Religious Education, SIAMS or Collective Worship. These will be delivered by a DBE officer or consultant and are available in a range of formats to meet the needs of your school. This includes one to one support (headteacher/RE leader), small group (SLT/Ethos group, governors) or whole staff (staff meeting/INSET day).

The sessions can be delivered as a twilight (up to two hours), half day or full day and can be booked as an individual session or a series of support sessions. Member schools and academy trusts may wish to join with another school(s) to share the training and cost.

The cost of these sessions have been kept the same for 2023/24 for member schools providing excellent value for bespoke support.

School Effectiveness Support

The DBE provides school effectiveness support through its officer, Mark Whitehill. This work covers a broad spectrum of support to individual schools on school improvement, preparation for Ofsted, curriculum advice, and headteacher support, as well as access to a number of networks. It also includes liaison with local authorities and Multi-Academy trusts for schools experiencing difficulties.

Bespoke support offer for schools

As part of the school effectiveness offer, schools can request support on a range of aspects of school improvement. This bespoke service can be purchased at a preferential rate for members of the DBE Family of Schools.

- Some examples of the support available include:
- School self-evaluation review
- School Improvement Plan review
- Curriculum development and review
- Subject leader development and audit
- Governor readiness for inspection key roles and responsibilities
- Staffing structure enhancement roles and job descriptions
- Preparation for inspection
- Audit of classroom practice
- Audits of safeguarding practice

Support can be offered prior to Ofsted inspections, in order to discuss preparation and to assist with evaluation of current practice and areas for development. Support can also be offered to schools that may need help with post-inspection planning, in areas such as subject Leadership and curriculum design or development.

These are not exhaustive and exemplify themes which could be delivered. School leaders are invited to contact Mark Whitehill with any requests for support, so that clarity can be assured over the design of any brokered support and the methodology and time needed to ensure effective delivery.

A core element of the DBE's support for schools is provided through our training, courses programmes and networks.

For Academic Year 2023/24 this will be delivered through three key strands:

- Church school distinctiveness
- Career pathway and development in church schools
- Networks & Additional Services

The team have devised a comprehensive schedule for 2023/24 that supports Christian distinctiveness, designed against each of the six Inspection Questions (IQs) within the SIAMS framework. In addition, the schedule has been designed to support leadership at all levels within the context of church schools, offering multi-session programmes, as well as stand-alone courses. An overview of each is provided below.







HOW THE DBE SERVES OUR SCHOOLS

Chester Diocesan Board of Education provides all its Church schools and academies with a range of services which form the core level of our support.

These are free to all schools and academies at the point of delivery and include:

Leadership and Management

- Headteacher and Deputy/Assistant Headteacher appointments and recruitment. Attendance by a DBE officer (for headteacher appointments this is usually the Director of Education) at short-listing meetings and interviews, subject to appropriate consultation and agreement on dates.
- Advice and support with headteacher job descriptions and person • specifications, particularly with regards to the school's Christian character.
- Support for newly appointed headteachers, including a termly visit in the • first two terms. In addition, the facilitation of a mentoring scheme for new headteachers or headteachers who are new to headship in a Church school or academy.
- Monitoring the performance of schools through published performance data; liaising with local authorities and the DfE on school improvement on behalf of schools and academies; and providing additional support to RI schools and those in Ofsted categories.
- Diocesan attendance at inspection feedback and support for • headteachers and governors during the inspection process.
- Access to termly network meetings of Anglican Heads in geographical clusters.
- Initial support for schools in difficulties.

Governance and Admissions

- Guidance and assistance with the appointment of foundation governors.
- Regular briefings for Heads, Chairs and Incumbents on whole school, diocesan and wider education news and matters.
- Guidance documents on admissions including exemplar policies which satisfy the most recent legislation.
- Approval of admissions policies.
- Access to Chair of Governors of Church school network meetings.
- Support and advice for the re-constitution of Governing Bodies.

Religious Education, Collective Worship and SIAMS

- Production and revision of Diocesan Religious Education guidelines, including a diocesan syllabus for RE for Voluntary Aided schools.
- Diocesan attendance at SIAMS inspection feedback and support for headteachers and governors during the inspection process.
- Collective Worship guidance and support for all schools and academies.
- An invitation to attend the annual leavers' services for primary schools.
- Liaison with national SIAMS team on arrangement of denominational inspection (financially subsidised by the DBE).

School Buildings and Land Issues

- The management of property and trust matters for schools and academies in our roles as trustee/in support of site trustee and to signpost legal support relating to trust property issues.
- Support with School Condition Allocation (SCA) bids and co-ordination for approved projects (VA schools).
- When schools give management of DFC funds to the DBE, provision of the assurance return to the ESFA.
- Liaison with project architects, consultants and contractors related to approved projects (VA schools).
- Administration support for approved projects (VA schools).



School Structures

- Liaising on changes to the status, size and age range of schools.
- Facilitating and assisting in the development of collaborations and federations.
- Providing induction training for Trustees in Multi Academy Trusts focusing particularly on Trust responsibilities for Church Academies.

Training and Development

- Access to training courses, conferences and consultancy arranged by the Education Team and the wider Diocese.
- General enquiry support from the Diocesan Education Team.
- A monthly bulletin from the DBE with key information, updates and news for Church schools and academies.
- Access to the Chester Diocese website with information and guidance relating to Church schools and academies and current national education policy.



Headteacher Appointments

(including other senior leadership roles such as Chief Executives, Executive Principals and Heads of School)

- Chester Diocesan Board of Education takes its commitment to supporting the process of appointing a new headteacher of its Church schools and academies very seriously and should always be involved in the appointment process.
- As soon as the Governing Body are informed of the current headteacher's resignation, the Chair of Governors should contact the Diocesan Director of Education (via the Diocesan office).
- It is important that no dates are set for the recruitment process with Local Authority officers or MAT colleagues until the Director of Education has been consulted and agreed a date that a Diocesan representative can be present.
- Appointing a headteacher is a time consuming process which requires a number days of officer time. This time is included by the DBE in our core service at no charge, providing that our Church schools and academies consult the Diocese at the beginning of the process. Failure to advise the Diocesan Board of Education could result in additional charges being made in order to facilitate attendance at meetings at short notice.
