St. John's is the oldest continuously used place of worship in Cheshire, steeped in nearly a millennium of history.

As a Grade I listed building, it holds a significant architectural and historical importance.

In 2025, we will proudly celebrate the 950th anniversary of the founding of the current church.

Our church is truly blessed to have His Grace, The Duke of Westminster, as our Patron. His steadfast commitment to our mission has enriched our parish in countless ways. His Grace's dedication to preserving our church's values and fostering our growth reflects both his noble heritage and his compassionate spirit. We are grateful for his guidance and honored by his involvement, which brings us strength and inspiration as we work together to serve our community.

Our site's rich heritage extends even further, as it once housed a Saxon Minster, traditionally founded in 689 by King Æthelred. This Minster likely succeeded an even earlier church, given our proximity to the Roman amphitheater.

Join Our Parish:

A Unique Opportunity to Lead and Grow in Faith

We are a vibrant parish with a rich Catholic tradition that we deeply cherish and wish to retain.

Currently, our community gathers for five weekly services:

Sunday: 8:00 AM Holy Communion (Book of Common Prayer), 10:00 AM, Sung Eucharist, and 6:30 PM Evensong (Book of Common Prayer, compline last Sunday of the month). Wednesday: 10:00 AM Eucharist and Friday: 12:00 PM Eucharist

Our ministry team consists of three dedicated priests with Permission to Officiate (PTO) and a committed reader, all of whom are passionate about celebrating these services and visiting parishioners in their homes. Our outreach extends beyond the church walls, as we bring the Eucharist to the residents of Callin Court Methodist Home and Belong, an intergenerational care village in Chester. Additionally, we have strong historical ties with the nearby Grosvenor Park Church of England Academy, just a few hundred yards from St. John's.

Like many communities, we have faced challenges in the wake of the pandemic, with some parishioners not yet returning to regular worship and an ageing congregation. Our connection with Grosvenor Park Academy has also weakened in the past year, and we are eager to restore and strengthen this vital relationship.

We see ourselves as a parish on the path to renewal and are searching for a rector who is not only well-organized and an excellent communicator but also has the vision and energy to help us grow our congregation. While we honour our traditions, we are open to exploring more flexible approaches to worship if they will help us achieve our goals.

We take heart from the many prayers left and candles lit in our Lady Chapel, a clear sign of our enduring place and responsibility within the broader community. Beyond our services, we are keen to establish stronger ties with the local business community, broadening our outreach and impact.

Our Finance

We have recently conducted a comprehensive review of our finances to ensure the long-term viability of our parish and to meet our financial obligations. While our accounts are healthy, our plans for future activities are focused on improving our standing.

The St John's Project, which includes a shop and café in the south aisle, plays a crucial role in supporting our parish. Run entirely by dedicated volunteers, the café offers drinks, cakes, and other refreshments to visitors while also providing information about the church through a team of knowledgeable guides. The income generated by the St John's Project makes a significant contribution toward our costs, and it is essential to the future of St John's Church.

To enhance the appeal of the St John's Project, we are in the process of upgrading the servery's appearance and diversifying the range of products and food we offer, making it more attractive to our visitors.

Our heritage initiatives, including talks and other events, are also organized through the St John's Project. We are currently planning to curate a permanent public display of the sculpted stones that are presently scattered in the north aisle.

For any future incumbent, involvement in the ongoing development of the St John's Project would be both beneficial and rewarding, as it is integral to the future of our parish.
